## Central Intake

Provides coordination of emergency shelter placement for children ages 0-17 referred by court, social services or law enforcement

## Community Health Clinic

Direct health care, immunizations, developmental screenings, integrated physical and mental health care, well-child and well-teen check-ups, dentistry and optometry referrals for children ages 0-20

*St. Joseph's Home for Children provides shelter and comprehensive mental health services to 2,000 children each year. Hope Street for Runaway and Homeless Youth helped 1,500 youth and young adults through street outreach, emergency shelter and transitional housing in 2008. Northside Child Development Center provided early childhood education and an after-school educational environment for 213 children and teens.*
